
INDUSTRY COMPETENCY FRAMEWORK (ICF)

- >> SIDC as the learning and development arm of SC Malaysia rolled out the Industry Competency Framework (ICF) on 6 July 2017.
- >> The ICF aims to provide universal guidance of competencies expected of capital market professionals and enhance competitiveness of the industry in view of the changing global landscape.



>> The ICF is the first comprehensive competency framework for the Malaysian capital market.





>> The framework is also expected to expand the curriculum for Continuing Professional Education (CPE), beyond knowledge and skills in technical, digital application, ethics and corporate governance programmes for capital market professionals, to include behavioral competencies in areas of self-management, people management and organisational leadership.

- >> The framework together with detailed competency model and dictionary were socialised with the industry in July 2017, followed by workshops to establish familiarity for its users. **234 participants** attended briefing sessions & workshops on the ICF.
- >> The ICF Microsite (www.sidc.com.my/ICF) was developed as a resource platform.

BUSINESS FORESIGHT FORUM (BFF) 2017
